PETER WHITE OAM

Peter's Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) was announced in the 2023 Australia Day Honours List. The award is in recognition of his service to veterans and the community.

Peter graduated from the Royal Military College, Duntroon, in 1967 and served with distinction for 27 years. During his military career, he was posted to various locations in Australia and overseas, including Vietnam in 1970/1. He retired from full-time military service in 1991, achieving the rank of colonel.

After discharge, he commenced a remarkable 30-year engagement in community service.

Peter was President of several ex-military associations, including the Terrigal Wamberal RSL sub-Branch. He was an active Matcham-Holgate Rural Fire Brigade member and was rewarded with a life membership for outstanding service.

Peter continues to serve the sub-Branch as Vice President.

JACK WADE OAM

Jack's OAM award acknowledges his service to the community through charitable organisations.

In addition to his membership in this sub-Branch, he is also an active member of Brisbane Water Legacy. Jack was called up for National Service and served in Vietnam in 1967/8 with 2 RAR.

His philanthropic support of the 2nd Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment Association and several health and medical research organisations is commendable.
