MEET THE MEMBERS

LUKE HILL



Hi, I am Luke, a Terrigal Wamberal Sub-Branch member, and I attend most monthly meetings. I have also just started swimming with the Veterans Ocean Swimming group on Thursday mornings in Terrigal and I enjoy catching up with members over a swim and coffee.

I grew up in Western Sydney and went to Mamre Christian College and St Mary's Senior High School. I worked in my father's bookshop out of school while I waited to be accepted into the Army. I joined the Army in July 1997 and was posted to the School of Infantry after completing basic training.

While at the School of Infantry, a Warrant Officer from the 3rd Battalion Royal Australian Regiment came to chat with my intake about volunteering for the Parachute unit. The cool video and motivating speech hooked me, and I volunteered on the spot with a bunch of mates. A few weeks later, I found myself in Holsworthy and then on the basic parachute course in Nowra.

My unit was deployed to Timor Leste in September 1999

with INTERFET and a second time with UNTAET in 2002.

I was discharged from the Army in 2003 to get married and travel to Europe. Whilst living in the tiniest motorhome you have ever seen in Scotland, I trained as a commercial diver and worked around the UK doing underwater surveys and construction.

I returned to Australia and worked around Sydney Harbour on underwater construction and salvage. A pretty hard gig, as you can imagine, spending every day enjoying the views and the occasional fish and chips from Doyles at Watsons Bay. The work become too sporadic as a diver, and having decided to start a family; I considered other employment opportunities.

I joined Corrective Services NSW and worked in numerous locations, including Parramatta, the State's oldest prison. I left after 13 years of service, and at the time, I held a commissioned rank as a trainer, working at the Corrective Services Academy.

I swam the English Channel in 2014 and used this challenge to raise \$50,000 for cancer research, a cause close to my heart after losing my mum to cancer at a young age.

I was also privileged to be a member of the Australian Invictus Games team in Sydney in 2018. This was an amazing experience for my family and me. Some surreal memories will stay with me forever, such as being lucky enough to climb the Harbour Bridge with Prince Harry and coming away with a Bronze medal in swimming.

At Invictus, I learnt about the power of using sport to connect and lift veterans from all services who have suffered not only physical but mental conditions from their service. From the crowds and personal feedback I received from friends and family, it was also a way to help people outside the military understand what veterans experience and have been through.

Thanks for reading a little about me, and I will see you all at the next meeting.

Earlier that day, we visited Parliament House for a walk around. In addition, Dr Gordon Reid,


the Member for Robertson, met with our group during a break in the lower house.

Len was diagnosed with an aggressive brain tumour several years ago and fought this insidious condition with courage and good humour until treatment was no longer effective.

Sub-Branch members gathered to celebrate Len's life at his funeral service on 7 December.

We have lost a good man and a great mate.
